- 09.4. *People in Research* run a **vacancy board** that advertises opportunities for members of the public to get involved in research. You can select East Midlands or look nationally. See it <a href="here">here</a>.
- 09.5. NHS England wants all information to be available in **accessible formats** easy read, audio, community languages and advocacy. They have started a project that will define a standard for this. There's more information and a survey for you to complete by 21/2/14 here.
- 09.6. In Jan 2014, every household in England will receive a leaflet explaining how **care.data** will work to bring together information about NHS treatment and outcomes. The leaflet will explain what to do if you have concerns about your information being used in this way. See <a href="here">here</a>.

- 09.7. As a member of the public, it's hard to find out what research is being done, so here's some places to look. Try the <u>ISR CTN</u> database, where there are over 12,000 projects listed, each with a plain English summary. You are invited to give feedback on whether each summary is clearly written. Alternatively, the <u>Clinical Trials</u> database lists 150,000 projects, or try the list of 500 projects known to <u>Cancer Research</u>.
- 09.8. The Health Research Authority have released a new 'decision tool' to help you decide if something counts as research. Another one helps you decide if your work needs to be reviewed by an ethical committee. See <u>Is</u> it research? and Does it need ethical review?
- 09.9. **Lay reviewers** of research funding applications will soon have the chance to join an online support group. See more <u>here</u>.
- 09.10.Staff who **blow the whistle** on poor conduct should be applauded for doing so. See what you think about Charlotte Munroe's situation <a href="here">here</a>. See advice here on how staff should **apologise** when things go wrong.
