
SHOPABILITY 75 in Loughborough is all about priority for pedestrians.

Two traffic lanes in front of the Town Hall could be exchanged for a busy pedestrian forecourt with seats and shrubs giving a lively, colourful, safe environment.








The Market Place as a car park could be transformed by repaving and tree planting to create a real Town Centre for the people of Loughborough.

Pedestrian Priority in Loughborough is all about being able to enjoy shopping in the town centre.


It's all about trading traffic for trees.

The diagram above shows the areas of Loughborough's Town Centre which are put forward as being suitable for inclusion in a pedestrian priority scheme.

In order to achieve a scheme for pedestrian priority, car parking would not be allowed in pedestrian streets, but loading and unloading of goods could take place for all or part of the day.

There would be restricted access for motor vehicles as the existing roadways would disappear under a new, 'one-level' paving scheme.

More places to sit and relax would be provided within a framework of trees and shrubs. Children could run about without fear of being knocked down by cars.

Why should anyone with any affection for Loughborough accept that at its heart lies a car park!

This is an opportunity to renew your Town Centre — to make it a place to be proud of and to enjoy.
