Choosing your hospital

How do I decide?

You may want to choose a hospital you **know**, or choose the **nearest** hospital to be close to family or friends. Your doctor, friends, family and other people can help you choose.



■ Can I choose the hospital that will treat me most quickly?

Yes. You could go to a hospital further away if they could treat you more quickly.



■ Can I choose the hospital for other reasons?

Yes. **Other things** might be important to you - like how clean a hospital is or what sort of treatment they are best at. It is important that the hospital can meet your health needs.



More about choice

■ Do I have to choose straight away?

No. You can take away information about hospitals and decide **later** if you like.



Is there a choice of hospital for all treatment?

No. You have a choice of hospital for most, but not all treatments. Your doctor will tell you if you can choose and will tell you what your choices are.



■ Can I get help to travel to the hospital?

You may get help or have your travel costs paid but this depends on what your health needs are or if you are on benefits.



Do I have to choose?

No. Your doctor can choose for you. Your family, friends, advocate or support worker can also help you choose.
