



**Know your rights** 

This information is to

- Tell you what your rights are in the needs assessment
- To find out if the person doing your needs assessment is doing everything they should be.

There is a dictionary of some of the words in this information that are harder to understand. Have a look at the 'know your rights campaign dictionary' if you don't know what a word means.

#### The law

A law means a rule that everyone has to follow.



There are laws that help to keep people with Autism safe and to make sure that people with Autism get the right support.

There is a list of laws in the law document

#### **Needs** assessments

A needs assessment is how someone would check what help you might need to do everyday tasks.



The Care Act says that all local authorities (social care) and the NHS (health care) teams must do a list of things.

#### After the assessment



The council should send you a copy of your assessment.

The council should send you a Care Plan. A Care Plan tells you what help the council think you need.

You can keep these somewhere safe

#### The assessor



Has the assessor met you before?

It is really important that the assessor has met you more than one time.

It is important that the assessor understands how your needs change.



The law says that councils have to check that

- Anyone who makes decisions about the lives of adults with autism needs to have the right knowledge and skills.
- An assessor who does a needs assessment has the right knowledge and skills
- An assessor who does the needs



assessment has been trained

 Autism they need to talk to someone who knows a lot about Autism
