Include the address and postcode of the venue but there is no need to say Nottingham. Be clear about what people need to do to participate — register in advance, bring a blanket, spend money at the gate. Highlight aspects that would be attractive to newcomers to Nottingham. Embed links to more detailed information. Don't assume people understand what you offer — say that the 'ice centre' is for skating! Thank you so much, everyone!
